Conclusion/Selection(s)

BURROWS EDGE (N Henderson) – Henderson has won this race twice in the past 7 renewals with very similar types, that is horses coming back to hurdles after one aborted attempt over fences. Indeed since 2007 he's sent four horses to this race off the back of a spin over fences and they've all at least placed (3-4-1-1), that micro-angle mixed with the overall race trends are solid pointers to this ones chances as is the form of the horse over 2m4f+ trips (1F123 – 2/5, 2p).

NORTHOFTHEWALL (D Skelton) – Worth taking a chance on this 6yo given how unexposed he is in handicap company (only his second start in a handicap). The penny clearly dropped big time last time out as well (a staying on strongly 11L winner) and this step up in trip should suit him. Also worth noting that Dan Skelton's GB & IRE bred Handicap Hurdlers (single figure SP) that ran in a Maiden Hurdle last time out return solid figures (since 2015)...15/39 | 38.5% S/R | +£33.98 BFLSP – W&P 20/39 | 51% S/R – 53% above expectation...if you only look at those ridden by Bridget Andrews you get...11111 (5/5)...this lad qualifies on those angles.

Thoughts on other shortlister...

Nothing major against the fav here but a bit of nit-picking tells me that Olly Murphy is only 2/25 at Kempton and 2/35 in Class 1 contests. I'm sure those stats will improve at some point but it's maybe just enough at present to put me off...

Conclusion/Selection(s)

I'd be happy enough to back the three trends toppers, with win punts on The Conditional & Kimberlite Candy and an E/W flyer on J Bresilien...

THE CONDITIONAL (D Bridgewater) – Beat two next time out G3 winners when winning over 3m1f at Cheltenham in October and then backed that up with a close second in the Ladbroke Trophy at Newbury, meaning he comes in here with the best recent form of the field and still looks like a chaser with plenty more to give. Also worth noting the following trainer angle...Bridgewater in Handicap Chases over 3m2f+ with runners NOT making seasonal debut and starting at a single figure $SP = 16/45 \mid 36\% S/R - 64\%$ above expectation...which The Conditional qualifies on.

KIMBERLITE CANDY (T Lacey) – First-time cheek-pieces last time out saw him match his career best effort on the figures and if they work again this time round then he can go close here. Trainer Tom Lacey has a decent record at the track in the last two years, especially with those that start in the top 3 in the market during the September to March period (5/10, 3p) and with the National the aim for this lad they'll need to be getting him up the weights to guarantee a place in the big one, meaning he should be ready to fire here.

JOUEUR BRESLIN (R Curtis) – Harder to make a solid case for this one but it is a race that's often won by one at lofty odds and he comes here completely unexposed over a staying trip (so there could be any amount of improvement to come). Jack Tudor back in the saddle for only the second time also interests me, given that he won the only previous time he sat on the horse and is able to take off a very handy 7lbs here (meaning the horse will be racing off an absolute feather-weight).
