13 Stats to help you profit from the 2025 Cheltenham Festival...

Welcome to the first **FREE Narrowing The Field (NTF)** guide for the **2025 CHELTENHAM FESTIVAL**...

This report highlights **13 Stats and Angles** associated with the **Cheltenham Festival...**

There were any number of my own saved angles I could have included in this guide... the 13 I eventually settled on are ones I feel will give you an excellent chance of finding winners, and whittling out the losers, at the **2025 Cheltenham Festival**...

Some of these angles I've made available at previous Cheltenham Festivals, and when adding them to this guide I've made sure they are all bang up to date and correct for this year's meeting...

As is always the case with an NTF guide, it is entirely up to yourself how you wish to utilise the information and how you want to add it to your own punting methods...

You may wish to make use of all these stats and angles... you may want to pick and choose a couple that appeal to your own punting style... you may find the guide sparking your brain to go off and source your own similar angles... the choice, as always, is up to you...

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The Best Stats Profile to find the winners of the Grade 1 Chases

30 of the 30 Grade 1 (Non-Novice) Chase winners at the last 10 Cheltenham Festivals passed ALL of the following Stats...

- ✓ Aged 7yo-10yo
- √ SP 16/1 or less
- ✓ Previously WON at least at Grade 2 level
- ✓ Ran in a NON-Handicap Chase Last Time Out (LTO)
- √ Days Since Last Run (DSLR) 31-120
- √ Last win came in a Class 1 Chase

It's maybe a tad 'general' and bit of a 'one size fits all' type of an approach... and the overall stats for the races in question (QMCC – Ryanair Chase – Gold Cup) do vary from race to race... BUT if you are looking for a VERY quick method of finding the most likely winners of the Festival Grade 1 (Non-Novice) Chases then the above set of trends is as good a starting point as any....

If you had backed all qualifiers to Betfair SP (131 of them) then you would have made a profit of **+£94.85 BFLSP**... although the stats are probably much more useful as a 'starting point'... and they would have **knocked out 179 of the G1 Chase 'losers' in the past 10 years**. You'd still have some work to do, but you'd certainly be well on your way to finding the likeliest winners (based on previous stats)...

Previously Won/Placed in the SAME Festival race

Horses that had previously Won or Placed in the **SAME Festival race** have pulled in serious profits...

'Festival Form' will be a term that you hear plenty of during, and especially in the lead up to, the 2025 festival... and whilst it may be overplayed, to a certain extent, there is actually some merit to it... especially when the horse in question is once again running in a race where they have previously banked some Festival Form... and by that I mean they have previously WON or PLACED in the SAME RACE at previous Cheltenham Festivals...

Last season **STATE MAN, LANGER DAN, CAPTAIN GUINESS, TEAHUPOO, SHAKEM UPARRY** and **GALOPIN DES CHAMPS** all won in a race they had previously won or placed in... whilst **FLOORING PORTER** and **PIED PIPER** both placed (at a 9/1 & 14/1) in a race they had previously won or placed in...

At the 2023 Festival **SIRE DU BERLAIS, DELTA WORK, ENERGUMENE, HONEYSUCKLE and CORACH RAMBLER** all won in a race they had previously won or placed in... whilst **QUEENS BROOK, CAMPROND, GLOBAL CITIZEN, MILL GREEN & SHANTOU FLYER** all placed (at a double figure price) in a race they had previously won or placed in...

The 10-year stats read...

Cheltenham Festival | Horses that had previously WON or PLACED in the SAME race | Rated no more than 15lbs below top-rated horse 43/273 | 16% S/R | +£431.92 BFLSP - W&P 92/273 | 34% S/R

21% above expectation | E/W returns = +£218.06

The Best Stats Profile of Novice Hurdle Winners

27 of the 30 Grade 1 Novice Hurdle winners (excluding the Triumph) at the last 10 Cheltenham Festivals passed ALL the following Stats...

- √ Had an official rating of 136+ (or were yet to be allocated a rating)
- √ Had a 67%+ Win & Place Hurdle strike-rate
- ✓ Top 3 finish LTO in a C1-C4 Hurdle race and starting at an SP of 8/1 or less
- √ DSLR 28 or more

Again, like the G1 Chase angle that started this guide, this is a tad on the 'general' side, but nevertheless it has captured **90% of the last 30 G1 Novice Hurdle winners** and if you had backed the angle blind it would have returned the following figures...

27/186 | 15% S/R | +£204.24 BFLSP - W&P 63/186 | 34% S/R 12% above expectation | E/W returns = +£76.64

Almost certainly best as a 'way-in' rather than a follow blind type of angle... but it has been a damn good shortlist builder for the **Cheltenham Festival G1 Novice Hurdles**, that's for sure...

Narrowing the Handicap Hurdle Fields

39 of the 40 Handicap Hurdle winners were aged 5yo-8yo and had 22 or less career starts

*The Boodles 4yo Handicap Hurdle is not included in these stats

You probably don't need me to tell you that the best place to look for the winners of Cheltenham Festival Handicap Hurdles is the younger and less exposed types... but the fact that **98% of the winners of those races** could be found by using just the two trends - aged 5yo-8yo and 22 or less career starts - is well worth highlighting...

...and we can add three more stats to help narrow these fields further... with **37 of the 40 winners** passing the following five trends...

- ✓ Aged 5yo-8yo
- √ 22 or less Career starts
- √ 0-5 previous CAREER wins
- √ 0-3 previous HANDICAP Hurdle wins
- ✓ Ran in a Hurdle race last time out

Nothing overly groundbreaking there and you would still have to do plenty of work to whittle the races down further... but the above stats knocked out **313 Handicap Hurdle losers** (and only the 3 winners) and still left you with **125 of the 160 Win and Place horses** from the ultra-competitive Cheltenham Festival Handicap Hurdle races...

The Mares Races

22 of the 23 winners of the Mares' races at the last 10 festivals ALL passed the following stats...

- √ Had between 2 & 20 previous career starts
- √ 1-5 starts in the current season
- √ Had an official rating of 135+ (or were yet to be allocated a rating)
- ✓ Finished 1st, 2nd or 3rd Last Time Out in a Class 1, 2 or 3 race

Giving an overall set of figures of...

22/107 | 21% S/R | +£134.12 BFLSP - W&P 42/107 | 39% S/R

17% above expectation | E/W returns = +£72.19

A bit of a rough and ready approach but the simple facts are that using the above would have found you **22 of the 23 winners of the Mares' races** at the last 10 Cheltenham Festivals...

Ideally you would still be looking to do a bit more trimming once the above stats had produced a shortlist for you... but they *have* proven to be an excellent starting point for your Mares' races analysis...
